A Word from Bro. Keith A Gift of a Dozen Brown Eggs

The month and year was August 1981. Willa Dean and I had been married in the previous December, two days after Christmas. Now it was the hottest part of summer, and we were moving to Fort Worth, Texas, where I would begin attending seminary.

We had a 14-foot U-Haul packed full of life's treasures and junk. Willa Dean married a pack rat. Even as a young man, I tended to hang onto papers, memorabilia and even the primitive electronics of the era that might one day have use. Much of the papers and memorabilia I still have these 39 years later. Probably some of the electronics and other obsolete clutter is buried somewhere in file transfer boxes in various closets and in a miniwarehouse. I'm convinced life's accumulation of stuff quietly multiplies when out of sight, out of mind.

Back to the seminary transition: We arrived and, best I remember, stayed in an inexpensive motel for two or three days until we found a rental house within walking distance of the seminary. It wasn't in great shape or the least bit spacious, but it was in our price range, and we ended up living there for 13 months.

The landlady was Mrs. Stanfield. I think the house had been her family's home before they relocated to a rural area maybe 30 miles away where we visited later and saw chickens around her house. We gave her pretty much the last cash we had for a deposit, first month's rent, etc. She probably noticed me having to empty my wallet, because before she left she went to her vehicle and retrieved a carton of a dozen brown eggs that had probably been laid by the hens she owned.

I'm not sure why she had the eggs in her vehicle except she had rented to seminary students before and perhaps knew of the likely need of new arrivals. To this day, I remember her kindness. Being cash-poor, we definitely needed those eggs and were grateful for the gift. God often moves and provides in mysterious and memorable ways, and I'm thankful that He did in that moment through the generosity of Mildred Stanfield.
