A Word from Bro. Keith Being the Church

Luke 5:37-39: "And no man putteth new wine into old bottles; else the new wine will burst the bottles, and be spilled, and the bottles shall perish. But new wine must be put into new bottles; and both are preserved."

In the history of New Testament interpretation, this verse has been applied in numerous ways. When I think about it in today's world context with the coronavirus pandemic, it seems especially applicable.

Churches have been pushed into new ways of thinking and doing. Creativity from many congregations has emerged in the form of such examples as drive-in worship, online giving, Zoom Bible studies and livestreaming worship services. At Highland Avenue, of course, we've forged our own path and continue to do so. Ye olde interim pastor livestreams his Sunday sermon from home in the living room. What interesting times we live in, and what unexpected actions have emerged as God's people adapt and cope with sheltering at home, the so-called new normal and the safer-at-home paradigm! Most congregations are finding ways to continue "doing church" as the COVID-19 virus remains on the loose.

More important than methods of doing church is our fresh realization that we as believers are the church. Sometimes in shorthand fashion, we speak of the buildings in which we meet as the church, such as: "Let's go to church on Sunday." It's okay to speak like this for convenience's sake, but I think the pandemic has helped us re-clarify in our minds and remind us that Christians must consciously and conscientiously "be the church" – even if at times we haven't been able to gather in the church house.

I hope this will be a freshly grasped truth that we will remember for many months and years to come, long after most of God's faithful are able to return to in-person gatherings in a central location for worship, Bible study and fellowship.
